Project Name: I-75 Pavement Rehabilitation in Hancock County (6178)

Community: Hancock County

Project Description: Pave deteriorated sections along Interstate 75 in Hancock County, starting at State Route 613 north to the Wood County line.

Project Sponsor: Ohio Department of Transportation

Community Economic Distress Factors: Hancock County, with an unemployment rate of 5.15%, has been designated as a High Unemployment rate county.

Economic Development Potential: I-75 is one of the state's major North-South trucking routes. The improved roadway will ensure continued safe and efficient movement of people and freight along this important economic corridor.

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: The grinding and paving of this section of I-75 is necessary to maintain a safe and efficient travel surface for the traveling public. If the surface is not repaired, then further deterioration will occur, causing excess wear to vehicles. The existing pavement has outlived its expected life due to repeated exposure to salt and grit during the winter and excessive wear-and-tear caused by heavier hauling and vehicular loading.
