Project Name (ID Number): High Street Rehabilitation (12876)

Community (County/City): Village of Hebron,
Licking County Transportation Study (LCATS), Licking County

Project Description: The project begins at SR79 at the intersection of South High Street and terminates at the North end in a cul-de-sac created when the new SR79 was created. A two lane roadway (formerly SR79) passes through the Village of Hebron from North to South for a distance of approximately 1 1/2 miles. The project will include milling and repaving approximately 7920 linear feet of two lane asphalt roadway.

Project Sponsor: Village of Hebron

Community Economic Distress Factors: The jobless rate for Licking County is 9.1%. The average annual income in Licking County is \$53,357.

Economic Development Potential: High Street links locals to Buckeye Lake, a well-known Central Ohio recreational attraction and leads to State Route 79, a route that offers goods and services to consumers. Connecting businesses to large corporate occupants of the Newark Industrial and Mid-Ohio Parks, this project will increase safety and increase traffic to these areas.

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: This route is used as an alternative to State Route 79 for local residents, providing access to businesses and connecting goods, services and jobs.
