



Dayton Road Bridge Improvement/ Clark County

Project Name: Dayton Road Bridge Improvement (6991)

Community: Clark County

Project Description: This is Clark County's longest bridge and is in need of repair. The project will rehabilitate the structure and paint the Dayton Road bridge over the Norfolk Southern railroad near the Greene County Line. Work consists of repairing the existing piers, painting all substructure concrete, painting the superstructure steel, and sealing the existing concrete bridge deck on the bridge. The structure is 800 feet long and spans the Norfolk Southern Railroad northeast of the Clark/Greene County Line.

Project Sponsor: Clark County Engineer

Community Economic Distress Factors: Clark County jobless rate is 9.6%

Economic Development Potential: The project emphasizes system preservation in order to delay the replacement or major rehabilitation of this substantial structure for as long as possible. Dayton Road is a direct connection between Interstate 675 and the Springfield and Enon areas. This project will ensure continued connectivity.

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: The proposed project will insure continued connectivity from Springfield and Enon to I-675. The project connects to a current project on Dayton Road which will widen the roadway and improve safety and capacity. Improvements will benefit businesses and manufacturers who use the rail line and motorists along trucks who haul goods in and out of Ohio.

Work to Begin: 91 to 180 days

Estimated Completion: 4 months after project commencement

Stimulus Investment: \$384,877
