



Downtown Gateway Improvements City of Dayton

Project Name: Downtown Gateway Improvements (8893)

Community: City of Dayton, Montgomery County

Project Description: Making downtown Dayton more appealing to perspective businesses, visitors and those who work and live downtown is what this project will accomplish. The proposed five gateway features will include resurfacing, curb and sidewalk repair, median landscaping, tree lawns and wider sidewalks. This project also includes removing and replacing all of the damaged curb and walk throughout the downtown, and resurfacing of the following streets:• Third Street from I-75 to Webster Street. • Sixth Street from Main Street to Wilkinson Street • First Street from I-75 to Jefferson Street • Monument Avenue from Wilkinson to I-75 and from Jefferson Street to Patterson Boulevard • Perry Street from Robert Drive to Monument Avenue • Wilkinson Street from Sixth Street to Monument Avenue • South Main Street from Sixth Street to Washington Street

Roughly 7,000 feet of the damaged curb and 90,000 square feet of damaged walk throughout downtown will be replaced and 117,000 square yards of downtown streets will be resurfaced.

Project Sponsor: City of Dayton

Community Economic Distress Factors: Montgomery County jobless rate is 11.2%

Economic Development Potential: The project will create approximately 50 jobs needed for construction. Improving the downtown infrastructure is not only safer and more efficient but an enticement for companies to move to downtown Dayton.

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: Enhancing the downtown is safer for pedestrians and motorists. Improving city streets and landscaping is an asset when trying to get businesses to locate in Ohio

Work to Begin: 91 to 180 days

Estimated Completion: Early 2010
