



Thoroughfare Resurfacing/Montgomery County

Project Name: City wide Thoroughfare Resurfacing (8894)

Community : Montgomery County/City of Dayton

Project Description: As the largest city in Montgomery County, Dayton has more than 150,000 residents. This project will improve the safety of five major thoroughfares that are deteriorating and will continue to unless improvement work is done. The project will resurface Connell Drive, North Main Street, Stanley Avenue, East First Street and Germantown Road.

Project Sponsor: City of Dayton

Community Economic Distress Factors: Montgomery County's jobless rate is 11.2% and the yearly median income is \$50, 418.

Economic Development Potential: The largest employers in Montgomery County are manufacturing, health care and education. Improving these major thoroughfares in the county seat will improve travel for residents and businesses especially the trucks that haul goods and services to market. Improved infrastructure is also more attractive to potential investors looking to locate in Montgomery County that is easily accessible to the state highway system, local airports and rail service.

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: Montgomery County is known as the birthplace of innovation. Improving major roadways is safer and provides better connectivity between the region's distribution centers and local employers including Behr Dayton Thermal Products, Dayton Power and Light, Kettering Medical Center and the University of Dayton. Montgomery County is linked to the state freeway system, has a regional transit service and many businesses uses rail to transport freight.
