



I-75 Phase 2/Hamilton County

Project Name : I-75 Corridor Phase 2 (PID 82282)

Community (County/City): Hamilton County

Project Description: This project is Phase 2 of the Hamilton Interstate 75 corridor improvement project. The scope of this project includes replacing the Monmouth Street overpass, and converting the roadway to a through street between Colerain Avenue and Central Parkway. Work also includes removal of the Bates Avenue overpass and pedestrian bridge.

Project Sponsor: ODOT

Community Economic Distress Factors: (county jobless rate, annual average income) 7.7 percent, \$41,000.

Economic Development Potential: Interstate 75 is a major thoroughfare for Greater Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky, connecting the region with Detroit, Mich., to the north and Miami, Fla., to the south. It also connects with I-74 and U.S. 50 to the east and west. Interstate 75 and the railroads that run parallel are among the busiest in the nation. This transportation system is the backbone of commerce and travel through the region..

Multi-modal Connectivity/Innovation Factor: According to Federal Highway Administration, I-75 is one of the busiest trucking routes in North America with truck traffic approaching six billion miles a year. In addition, more than 250 freight trains per day pass through or have destinations within the I-75 corridor.
