1056.01 Description. This supplement describes the procedure by which the Department will maintain a List of Prequalified Work Zone Raised Pavement Markers for use by and on contracts administered by the Department.

1056.02 Prequalification Procedure. Provide certified test data (no older than five years) from an independent laboratory including detailed engineering information, drawings, test results and descriptions which describe how each requirement of 614.115 is satisfied. Submit a sample with the test data.

1056.03 Removal from the Prequalified List. A work zone raised pavement marker may be removed from the prequalified list if, in the Department's sole discretion, the work zone raised pavement marker has substantially or recurrently failed to perform satisfactorily in the field.

1056.04 Reapproval. The Department will not return a work zone raised pavement marker removed from the prequalified list due to unsatisfactory field performance to the prequalified list until the manufacturer identifies the reason for the failure and the problem has been corrected to the satisfaction of the Department. Experiences of other States or governmental agencies may be considered in this action.

1056.05 Modifications to Prequalified Work Zone Raised Pavement Markers. It is recognized that manufacturers will occasionally modify certain aspects of their products in an effort to enhance performance, improve durability, reduce costs or for other similar reasons. Work Zone Raised Pavement Marker manufacturers must notify the Department whenever modifications are made to products contained on the prequalified list. The Department will review the changes being made and, at its sole discretion, decide what action, if any, is appropriate. Appropriate action includes limitation of usage or removal from the prequalified list.
