In reference to the maintenance of traffic notes:

- 1) A plan note states that ramp W1 will be shut down to complete the parapet work. Can the ramp be shut down indefinitely or do the I-90 lane closure restrictions apply to the ramp as well?
- 2) The maintanence of traffic notes state that the new parapet is to be constructed in two periods. Is it possible to drill and epoxy the rebar dowels during single lane closures during the week and leave barrels out to protect the rebar when the lane is reopened?
- 3) As is probably already known, there appears to only be six weekends during the duration of the job on which the Cleveland Indians do not play on a Saturday or Sunday. Since no lane closures are allowed for the 2 hours preceding an Indians game, there are only six possible weekends to complete the overlay work (and the parapet work if the answer to question 2 above is negetive). If weather impacts any of the six weekends and the completion date is extended, the Cleveland Browns games will impact the project. Is it possible to waive the lane closure stipulation regarding entertainment events?

Line number 28 (Item 517) is listed in the proposal as Railing, Misc: Retrofit 42". On plan sheet 21 of 34, the specification title for this item is Item 517 - Railing Misc.: Retrofit 42". Within this specification regarding payment, it states that the work will be paid under item 517, Railing Misc.: Retrofit 42" As Per Plan.

The proposal should list this item as an "As Per Plan" item.

Thank you for pointing out this inconsistency between the plans and the proposal. Per CMS 105.04, the discrepency will be resolved using the stated order of precedence. The Proposal rules over the plans. Bid the item as described in the Proposal.

In response to the pre-bid question answer regarding the 4"x4" drain holes in the new 42" parapet:

Since no permanent fixture is allowed to form the drain holes, is it allowable to drill 4" diameter core holes in lieu of forming/stripping 4"x4" square blockouts?

Since there is no way to use a temporary forming device for the drain slots and still slip form the parapet, the entire wall would have to be hand formed which would be extremely time consuming.

The addenda list and addenda summary links on ODOT's Office of Contracts' website for this project show only 1 addendum. We checked the website Friday (4/22/05) and Monday morning (4/25/05) and thought there was only 1 addendum.

When the project number clicked on (after clicking the addendum summary link), it is evident that there are 2 addendums. This could cause extreme confusion and delay the delivery of the information.
