Can alternate traffic control application TA-17 be used for two lane road rumble strips? We are looking for some type of mobile lane closure.

TA-17 is an acceptable MOT alternative. However, a Truck Mounted Attenuator and Arrow Panel Board on the shadow vehicle is required.

Question Number: 2

Does the Department of Transportation consider traffic control plan modifications post bid, when the contractor and the state identify safety problems with the existing plan?

The District would welcome any concerns related to safety problems during pre-bid so they could be addressed. If something comes up during construction that was not foreseen it would have to be handled post bid, but the preferred time to address concerns is pre-bid.

Question Number: 3

The general notes specify that grinding material shall become the property of the contractor and be disposed of at his expense outside the limits of right of way. Will the rumble strip grinding contractor be permitted to sweep the millings from the rumble strips to just beyond the edge of pavement or will you require the millings to be collected with pickup type road brooms and then hauled to offsite disposal locations?

The note titled Grinding Material on plan sheet 3/9 should be followed. How the material is picked up and disposed of is the contractor's choice.
