Vegetative watering is included in ITEM SPECIAL - MISC.: LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE. The Contractor will be responsible for the condition of the plants during each month. If dry conditions occur then the contractor must meet the moisture requirements by hauling water to the locations. If weather conditions are more favorable (wet) then the contractor meets the requirement without having to do any watering. 3. Fertilizer is included in ITEM SPECIAL - MISC.: LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE.
