The 4A note indicates poles will be relocated but does not address the elevation of the lines. Will the utility relocation provide adequate clearance for the bridge to be constructed?

For what duration during what time will the electric lines be de-energized and moved to allow for construction of the bridge?

Will the telephone lines be moved out of the way or will we have to work around them?
