Question Number: 1

This job has 2" of milling and 2" of paving which should result with the new pavement elevation close to the elevation of the existing shoulder. The Linear Grading note on page 7 of the plans requires a contingency quantity of grindings to be placed "As Directed by Engineer" to fill in "drop off" areas that may exist or be created by the equipment. The Typical drawing on the same page shows Linear Grading the depth of the new pavement (2") with grindings placed 2' wide. Are we to perform the linear grading item per the note or the Typical?

**Grindings are to be used as directed by the Engineer to fill in drop-off areas that are encountered. When these areas are encountered they are to be repaired as shown in the typical drawing (i.e. width, slope, etc.). The only thing that may be varied from the typical section is the depth of the drop-off and this will be dependent on the drop-off area that is encountered.**

Page 2/11 under resurfacing and planing operations it states "The contractor shall plane only the area that can be resurfaced during the permitted lane closures. Traffic will not be permitted to drive on a planed surface." Is it ODOT's intention to complete this project as a mill & fill by the end of each day?
