2. The plans state that the contractor is supposed to include time for the University of Akron to install the instrumentation and perform the testing. What is the length of time required for the entire process?
3. Is the contractor required to supply the University of Akron a place to store and install the instrumentation?
4. The plans state that the contractor is to provide all materials, equipment and labor to assist the Research Team in order to prepare for the instrumentation and monitoring of the landslide stabilization project. What type of materials, equipment and labor will be necessary?
