RESOURCES FOR SMALL BUSINESS

This listing highlights select state, federal and local resources that offer business assistance programming.

State of Ohio Programs

Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), Division of Opportunity, Diversity & Inclusion (ODI)

ODI works to increase diversity and inclusion opportunities for all stakeholders, including those seeking to do business with, and those who seek employment with ODOT. ODI's Office of Outreach initiates and coordinates outreach efforts including promoting certification and prequalification of Small and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (S&DBE) firms; contact with certified and prospective S&DBE firms to promote available services (e.g. technical training, tuition reimbursement programs, formal education courses); and discuss eligibility for prequalification to bid on highway construction and local public agency projects.

The State of Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA) offers the following business assistance programs to Ohio firms throughout the State:

Small Business Development Centers of Ohio (SBDC)

The SBDCs provide a high-impact, front-line program designed to facilitate small business growth, job creation and access to capital. Professional staff members provide confidential business counseling; management training and education programs; technical assistance; loan packaging guidance; and information on federal, state, and local regulations and programs for small business owners. The SBDC Network also includes specialty programs such as Export Assistance.

• Minority Business Assistance Centers (MBAC)

The ODSA Minority Business Development Division (MBDD) supports the growth and sustainability of minority-owned, small and disadvantaged businesses in Ohio through the MBAC program. MBAC professional staff members provide confidential business counseling; technical and professional assistance; access to capital and bonding; Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Encouraging Diversity, Growth and Equity (EDGE) certification assistance, and connection to business opportunities.

The MBDD provides access to capital programs including: Ohio Minority Business Bonding Program; Ohio Minority Business Direct Loan Program; The Collateral Enhancement Program and the Ohio Capital Access Program.

• Procurement Technical Assistance Centers (PTAC)

The PTACs help Ohio's businesses seeking to compete for federal, state, and local government contracts. The program is part of a nationwide network of PTACs created by the U.S. Department of Defense. Professional staff members provide business services including contract opportunities, research past contracts, help clients prepare bids and navigate requirements and assist clients after winning contracts.
