



ORDC/ODOT Announces Railroad Preempted Traffic Signal Training

The Ohio Rail Development Commission (ORDC) in conjunction with ODOT is offering a technical training session on the design and operational standards for railroad preempted traffic signals. Attendance is highly recommended for any ODOT, local government personnel, or consultant that will design or review railroad preempted traffic signals. ODOT will include attendance at an approved ODOT/ORDC class on Railroad Preempted Traffic Signal Training as a subfactor in the selection of a consultant for any project with a railroad preempted traffic signal.

The 1-day technical training classes will be held as follows:
