



Engineer-In-Training (Transportation Engineer Intern)

ODOT established the Engineering-In-Training (EIT) program to provide entry-level engineers a thorough introduction to the department's core engineering disciplines. By passing down the knowledge of seasoned engineers through a balance of continued education and hands-on transportation experience in planning and engineering, construction, and highway management, the 12 month training program helps ensure each participant matures professionally.

Who is eligible?

To be considered for ODOT's EIT Program, you must

- possess a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering.
- have registered to take or have taken the Fundamentals of Engineering Examination administered by the Ohio Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors.

What are the benefits of being a Transportation Engineer Intern at ODOT?

ODOT's Engineer-In-Training (EIT) is a full time entry level position introducing all newly hired engineers to the Transportation Engineer. Upon the completion of the EIT Program, as well as passing the F.E. Exam, EIT's are reclassified to Transportation Engineer – TE1. The Transportation Engineer structure includes six classifications (EIT through TE5), offering motivated professional a lifetime of growth and upward mobility.
