

SUMMARY OF FLOODPLAIN IMPACTS

Floodplain Affected: Auglaize River

Description of Project: The Ohio Department of Transportation is proposing to repair a slide along State Route (SR) 66 in Defiance County by installing a plug pile wall; drainage will also be improved and repairs will be made to the embankment. The slide is located along the slope on the east side of SR 66, just south of the bridge carrying the roadway over the Auglaize River. Construction is anticipated to begin in the summer of 2021.

Why must this project be located in the Floodplain?

The existing roadway is located within the boundaries of the floodplain; as a result, it would not be practical to reengineer the existing roadway to avoid work in the floodplain.

What alternative sites were considered, if any?

Based on the scope and purpose of this project, there are no possible alternative sites to consider.

Were any mitigation measures utilized on this project? If so, please describe.

Project activities will not change the alignment, grade, or hydraulic capacity of the Auglaize River; therefore, no mitigating measures are needed.
