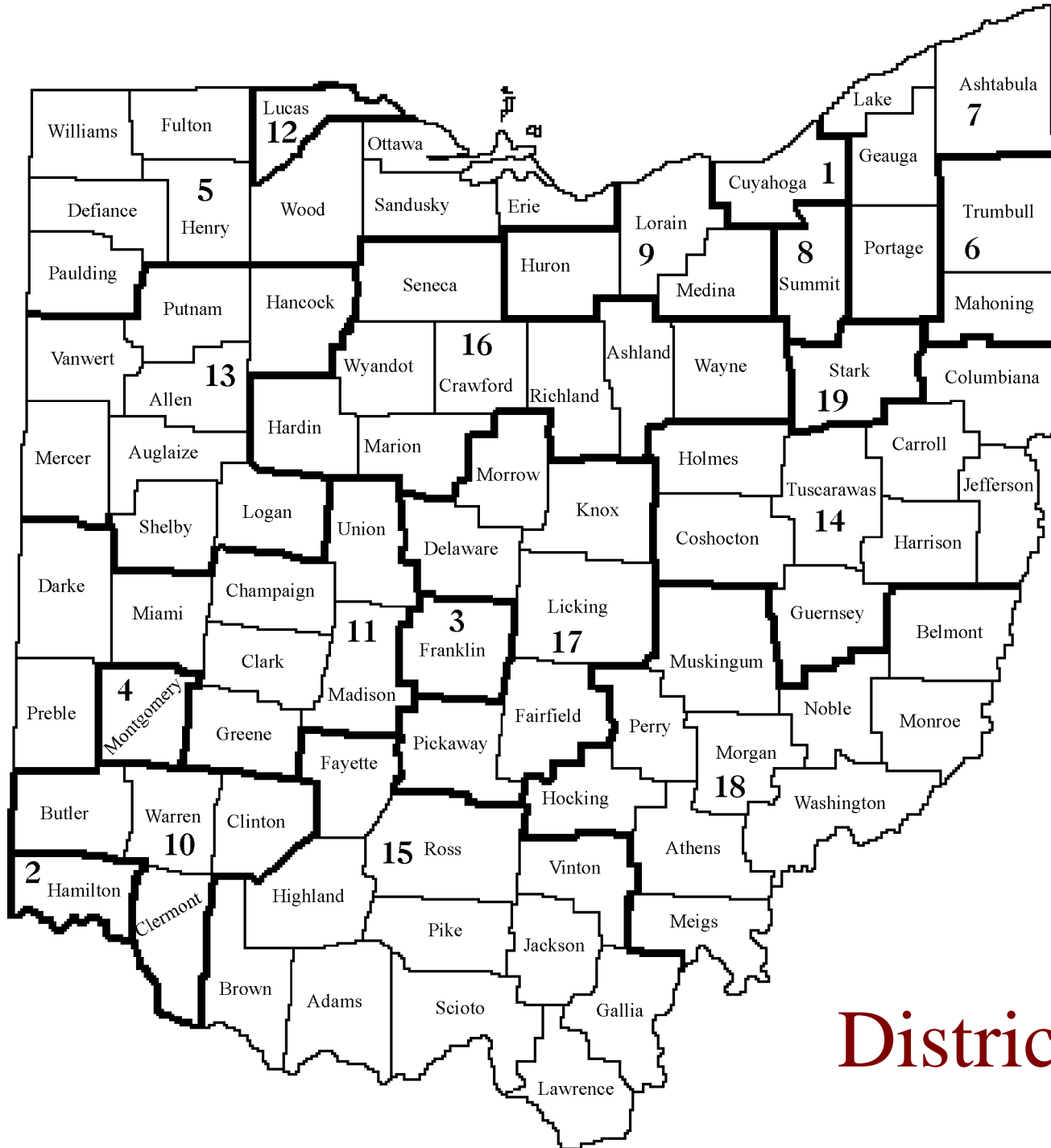

# Criteria for District Scoring Methodology

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1. Infrastructure repair and replacement needs of the district
2. Age and condition of the system
3. Revenue generating (user fees/assessments)
4. Health and safety
5. Project cost consistent with district allocation for grants, loans, local debt support, and credit enhancement.



# Criteria (continued)

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6. Local funding
7. Federal or other funding sources
8. Economic health of local subdivision
9. Planning and readiness to proceed
10. Other factors relevant to the particular project



# Goals of the Economic Stimulus Package

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- Economic stimulus
- Support key industries
- Build infrastructure critical to Ohio's growth



# Economic Stimulus-8 Key Investments

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- \$100 million for Biomedical
- \$50 million for Bioproducts
- \$150 million for Advanced Energy
- \$100 million for Logistics and Distribution
- \$250 million for Internship and Coops
- \$120 million for Historic Preservation Tax Credits
- \$400 million for Clean Ohio
- \$400 million for Infrastructure



# Infrastructure Investments

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- \$120 million in accelerated SCIP bonds
- \$200 million in budget stabilization fund transfer to LTIP
- \$80 million Jobs Fund transfer to SCIP and Broadband
