The general notes specify that grinding material shall become the property of the contractor and be disposed of at his expense outside the limits of right of way. Will the rumble strip grinding contractor be permitted to sweep the millings from the rumble strips to just beyond the edge of pavement or will you require the millings to be collected with pickup type road brooms and then hauled to offsite disposal locations?

**The contractor may waste the grinding material along the berm provided there are no environmentally sensitive waterways.**
