Ref. 38 does not indicate the type of bollard. We presume any bollard type from the Standard Drawings is acceptable.

The use of the standard drawing is acceptable, no specific type of bollard is required.

We would like clarification regarding in-stream work. On page 3/16 of the drawings, note #3 indicates no in-stream work work is permitted unless the 404/401 permit is modified by the contractor. On page 1 (second paragraph) in the Nationwide permit included in the drawings, it reads "This permit authorizes temporary structures, fills, and work necessary to construct the linear transportation project". If a contractor wishes to build a temporary causeway for a crane pad (with clean non-erodible fill), can this be done without modifying the 404/401 permit? Please advise. Thanks.

The application for the permit applied for by the district was made with the understanding that no in stream work would be necessary, therefore the environmental commitment as stated on page 3/16 note #3 is being made. Even though the permit states "This permit authorizes temporary structures, fills, and work necessary to construct the linear transportation project", this is not allowed based on the application for the permit.

Under the "Pre-Engineered Bridge – Specifications" section it states: "All fracture critical members shall be identified on the plans ..." Fracture critical welding is typically not applied to pedestrian truss bridges by AASHTO or AISC. Is this bridge required to have fracture critical welding?
