The Window of contract time alotted for SR 134 & SR 73 is not enough time to complete all the work 100 % in the time that is specified out on page 9 of 102 of the project plans. SR 73 can be open to traffic in the alotted time of 150 calendar days but not complete. SR 134 cannot be done in the alotted 70 calendar days due to the sequence that it has to be built. This concern was previously mentioned in an earlier pre-bid question by another contractor. Both bridges need time to perform prep work prior to closing the bridges such as installing falsefloors for demo and false floors along the piers at SR 134 for pier construction and jacking. Even after the bridges are built there is time required to perform removal of the deck forms and spot painting. In both of these cases the bridges are tied to lane closure times on IR 71. Just the Spot painting can use up to 12-16 days of contract time just for each bridge. There needs to be more contract time to complete the items of work on this project. Would the department consider changing the window contract table to work days instead of calendar days for road closure time?

The intent of the Window Contract is to define the number of days traffic is impacted by the operation. If we modify the note so the contract becomes work days instead of calendar days, we have lost control over the number of days SR 73 has a temporary signal in operation an SR 134 is closed to traffic. Therefore, the answer is no.

For reference 16 type D barrier wall, no bid item is set up for end sections and the wall has guardrail attachments will a bid item for the type D end sections be set up?For the half and half construction of S.R. 73 in phase 2 the plans call for unachored barrier wall over the bridge. Is this correct as there will only be 2 ft. of concrete remaining when the deck is removed in phase 2? It appears as if a hot joint seal is called for on sht 91/102 over top of the PEJF. Where is this joint seal to be paid? The plan note on 86/102 for the jacking item states that the superstructure is to be raised by 7 inches. However, on the pier sheets it appears as if the pier cap is raised by approximately 18 inches at every location, is this correct? The 70 day closure for S.R. 134 seems to be too tight we request that the time allowed for the closure be 90 days as time must be allowed for the jacking and pier work as it must be completed to establish grades before any decking can begin.
