There is a Type "B", Type "C", Type "D", and Type "E", wall details as categorized in the modification sheets. So there will be 4 samples. Note that Wall Modification Type "A" was to be used on opening 1 and was crossed out on sheet 41 and other places in the plans.

On 16/61 note 2 calls for epoxy urethan sealer that matches adjacent walls. The adjacent walls do not apear to have epoxy urethane sealer and there is no pay item for epoxy urethane sealer. Should this note call for non-epoxy sealer?

Sheet 16/61 as stated on said sheet applies to wall location #1. As shown on sheet 41/61, wall closure #1 has been crossed out. Other portions of sheets in the plan were crossed out and the quantities for this wall were deleted prior to submission for sale.

Question Number: 3

On 3/61 both the Class C Concrete and the Patching Concrete Structures notes refer to matching the color and texture of the wall panel facings to the adjacent wall panels as close as possible. The notes go on to say the work has to be approved by the project engineer and the City of Cincinnati. What measure will be used to determine if the work is "as close as possible"?

Also these notes states that, "A SAMPLE OF THE FINISHED CONCRETE PRODUCT THAT HE INTENDED TO USE FOR THE PATCHING." The wall is to be , "AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE", and the sample is the venue that will work out the quality component of the work. This is standard verbiage that the City of Cincinnati has used in the past with great success.
