However, this is an isolated intersection, no interconnect of any kind and no existing closed loop system, futhermore on plan page 57/79 it states that the controller is to have "INTERNAL TIME BASED COORDINATION...". Why is it necessary to have a conflict monitor capable of reporting via a closed loop host computer if the intersection is not interconnected or in a closed loop system? Will there be an addendum released removing that requirement from the specification?

The requirements for the controller were included to provide flexibility for any future improvements that may add signalization on Lake Road or US 224.
