A1:The W12x65 is the correct section. Drawings are not to scale as noted on sheets.A2:There is only one coating. Coal Tar Epoxy Coating. It is required on both the panel seat and pile.

If aggregate is required on the shoulder to maintain traffic, how should this be accounted for in the biditems? Is it incidental to the Maintaining Traffic biditem?

A1:See Sheet 3, Item 524 - Drilled Shafts ACCESS Note. The contractor shall be responsible for the means and methods used to construct the drilled shafts and place concrete panels, the cost of any excavation and subsequent replacement of embankment (per item 203 Embankment) shall be included in the various bid items for the drilled shafts and concrete panels. No seperate payment will be made. A2:Aggregate is NOT required on the shoulder to maintain traffic.
