The note on the Portable Concrete Barrier on sheet 4 states that it to be placed at the locations shown on the plans. However, there are no details on where the barrier wall is to be placed or how much room we will have to work with on the existing pavement. Also, with the work area only 1500 If the quantity of 5,430 If seems excessive. Please provide details and locations for this item of work.

Plan sheet 4/35 states that sheet pile wall installation will begin within 7 days after the signing of the contract. Continue until all sheet pile wall is installed. Is the intent for the contractor to work 24 hours per day 7 days a week, one crew 7 days a week, or will the contractor be able to work an approved 48 hour week with one crew?

At a minimum, ODOT would expect the contractor to continuously work a standard work week until all of the sheet pile is completed.

QUESTION#1: The existing plans for the area of this project entitled SAN-53-10.15 dated 2004 show work on the western slope of the embankment for the Norfolk Southern Railroad fill that is not reflected in the plans for Project 088042. Was the work along this slope not completed according to those 2004 plans? The existing slope shown on the proposed 088042 project plans is the same existing slope shown on the 2004 plans prior to its construction.

On page 3, lower right corner, Steel sheet piling note: Manufactures information shows that PZ22 sheeting sect modulas is 18.1 cuin/ft not 18.4. Do you need the section modulas specified or is standard PZ22 OK? Also A328 sheeting is not the standard rolled today in the industry. A572 grade 50 is the standard coming out of the mills. You will pay more for the lesser A328 material than the grade 50. If the calculations were based on grade 50 steel, would a lesser section modulas satisfy your design requirements? Also, availability of materials - rolling for sheeting is approximately mid to late January. Could we supply a cold rolled material (much less cost) that satifies your design criteria? We have seen cold rolled specified in other ODOT projects for permanent installations. Cold rolled is a more economical alternative for permanent installations.
