There is a conflict between paved shoulder widths shown in the Typical Sections on sheet 2/7 and the Shoulder Data shown on sheet 7/7. The Proposed Paved Shoulder widths on the shoulder data sheet are 1' less than the widths in the typical sections. Please clarify.

The typical section on 2/7 shows the pavement replacement 1' into the driving lane. The proposed paved shoulder width column on 7/7 shows the width of the paved shoulder only. The column for item 443 includes the proposed paved shoulder width plus the one foot into the driving lane.
