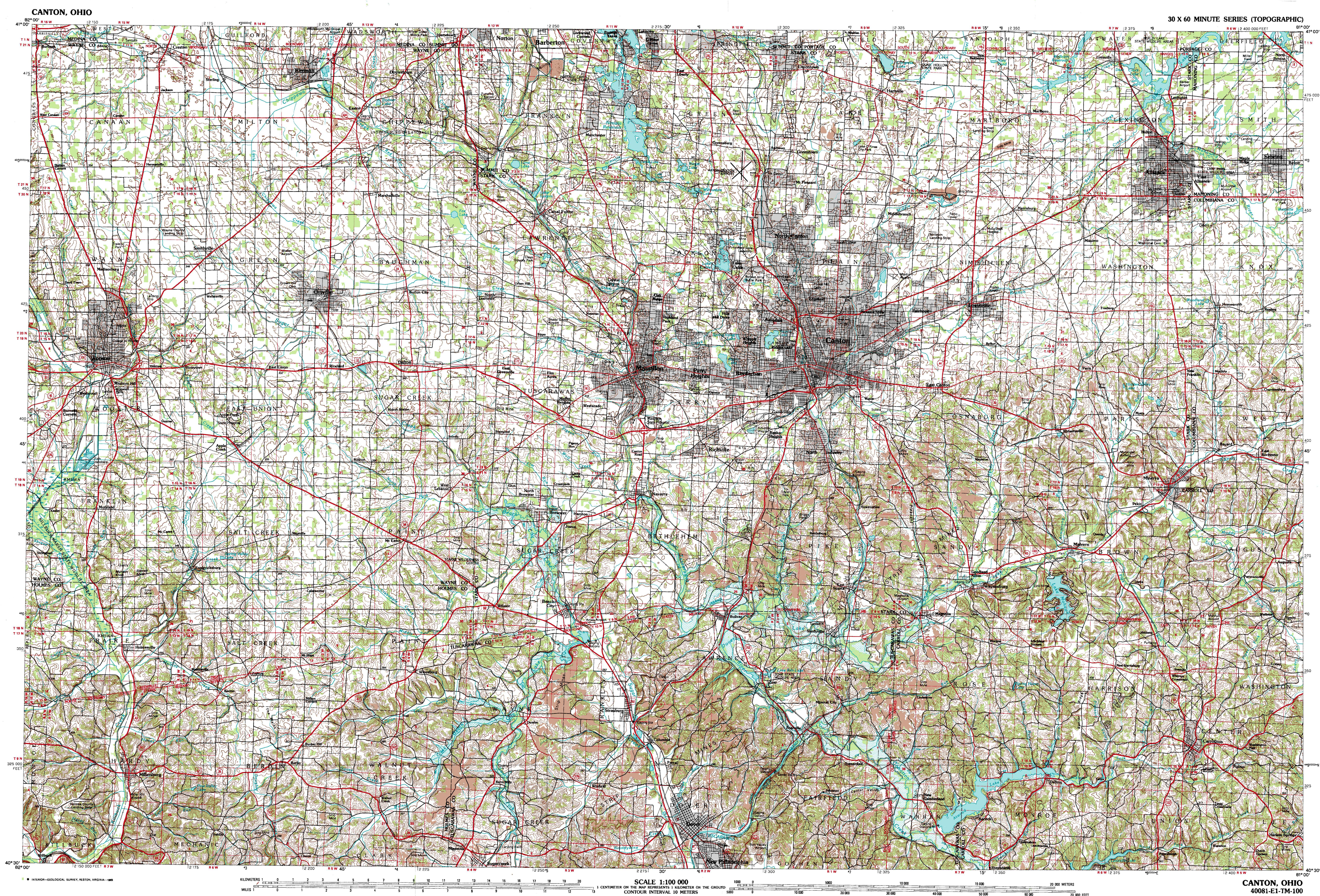




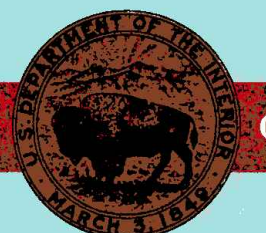
Canton OHIO

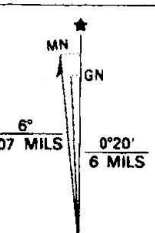
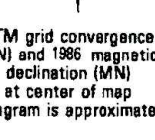
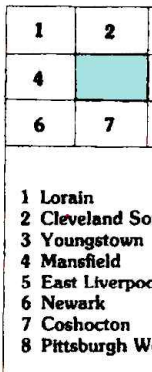
