What is a Bike Boulevard?

A bicycle boulevard is a low-volume, low-speed street where pedestrians and bicyclists are given priority over motorists. By design, bike boulevards divert vehicle traffic to larger roads in the area. Traffic calming and traffic reduction treatments such as signs, pavement markings and intersection enhancements help develop a designated bike boulevard.

Why Are People Using Them?

Bike boulevards provide bicyclists and pedestrians, especially those who are not comfortable on busy streets, a safer and more convenient place to travel. Since they are on existing infrastructure, bicycle boulevards are a relatively low-cost way to encourage more people to walk and bicycle.
