### Shared Lane Markings

#### What's a "Shared Lane Marking" anyway?

Sometimes you need to make a connection. The connection might involve a road heavily traveled by drivers and bicyclists, or there may not be enough room for a bike lane.

In some situations, a shared lane marking or "sharrow" may be the safest solution and exactly what is needed. Sharrows let drivers know to expect bicyclists on the roadway and also help bicyclists position themselves properly on the road, typically directly over the sharrow. This also helps to keep bicyclists out of the "door zone" when a road has

on-street parking.
